

For the Fourth Time PALBC is hosting the 2012 Lawn Bowling Division of Senior Games at our green.

The 12 Triples Teams will play on Tuesday and Wednesday March 20 and 21.

The 16 Pairs Teams will play on Thursday and Friday March 22 and 23.

The entry fee will be \$25 for either tournament or \$35 for both.

If a player is entered in just one of the two events (Pairs or Triples) it is \$25 per person

If a player is entered in both of the events it is \$35 per person (which covers both Pairs & Triples).

Please be sure to let Terry Hogan, who is running the event, know who your partners are, so he can coordinate the money. It would probably be best to have just one team member handle entry duties, and have the team reimburse that partner.

Following the same popular format as 2011 we anticipate a full field.

TRIPLES: Check in time will be 9:30. The first round will begin at 10 AM.

On Tuesday each team will bowl 3 ten end games. Opponents will be picked by draw ahead of time. After Tuesday games are complete the teams will be divided into 3 brackets. The top 4 teams will be in the Gold. Then four in the Silver and the last four in the Bronze.

On Wednesday check in time will be 9:30 and the first game will begin at 10 AM. All teams will be bowling for a medal the value will depend on your bracket. All teams will play 3 ten end games on Wednesday in a round robin sequence.

PAIRS: On Thursday check in time will be 9 AM with the first game starting at 9:30.

The 16 teams will be divided into 4 brackets by draw. Each bracket will play a round robin sequence. There will be 12 teams bowling at any one time so each team will have one bye round during the day. Each game will be 12 ends.

One team will come out of each bracket the winner. Only these four teams will return for the finals on Friday. Each team will return for two 14 end matches that day. The winners of the first game will play the second for the Gold and Silver. The losers of the first game will be playing a second for the Bronze.
